gensory Garden Gravestones

Introduction

In 2005-2006 members of the Village Improvement Committee, a sub-committee of Spondon Community Association transformed the disused cemetery in Chapel Street, Spondon into a sensory garden.

The sensory garden was officially opened on Saturday 17th June 2006 by the Mayor of the City of Derby, Councillor John Ahern. It won a Derby in Bloom award shortly after opening.

The cemetery

The burials in the cemetery are dated between c. 1840-1890.

The need for a new burial space had arisen because the clergy, had over time, acquired some of St Werburgh's Churchyard as part of the Vicarage walled garden. In 1839, after heated debates about this matter, the patron of the living, Rob Holden Esq, offered parishioners a piece of land (twice the amount), adjoining the new School Room, if they relinquished all claims to the Vicarage garden.

St Werburgh's old school, built in 1839, can be seen on the left-hand side of the cemetery. The cost of building the school was £700 and accommodated 220 pupils, who paid two pence a week to attend. It was enlarged in 1880 and could accommodate up to 550 children. In 1969 a new school was built just across the road.

A notice in the Derby Mercury 31 May 1848...

Thomas Dimock (deceased). For sale by auction two newly-erected dwelling houses with stables and out buildings situated at Stoney Cross by the side of the turnpike between Spondon and Borrowash.

These properties were let to Mrs Land and William Locker. Together with a croft of land on the turnpike, there were various other plots by the canal and Spondon Railway Station. Thomas had also owned the Bay Horse on Ashbourne Road, Derby, dwelling houses and a bake house on Ashbourne Road, Uttoxeter Road and Willow Row. In the early 1840's he was landlord of the Old Spot public house on St. Helen's Street, Derby. His son James owned the Spotted Horse on Victoria Street, and his daughter Sarah lived at The Bell on Sadler Gate.

The most famous burial in the cemetery is that of Enoch Stone who was murdered near the turnpike on Nottingham Road on 23 June 1856, whilst returning home from Derby. He was a poor man and well-liked around the village. There seemed to be no motive for his murder and his killers were never found. Enoch Stone was married to Elizabeth Porter on 3 March 1834. He was buried in Spondon on 26 June 1856, aged 48. No headstone is standing.

The names on the surviving headstones are recorded here along with some information taken from the census and other records held at Derby Local Studies and Family History Library.

Gravestone 29

In loving memory of ELIZABETH GASKIN BORN December 12th 1802 died June 17th 1868 (error on sheet 1888) Which therefore for you know neither the day nor the hour where is the son of man cometh (Matt xxv. v13) Also of WILLIAM GASKIN husband of the above born August 6th 1800 Died May 28th 1881

William(senior) was born in Willington and Elizabeth was born in Little Eaton.

William was buried at St Werburgh's Church on 31st May 1881

1841 Census: William Gaskin (sen) was living in Little Eaton with his wife Elizabeth and 5 children James 12, William 9, Elizabeth 6, Henry 4 and Sarah 2 months. William was a bottle man.

1851 Census: William Gaskin (sen) 51 coal dealer, and his wife Elizabeth 50 now were living in Spondon, possibly Stoney Cross Cottages with 6 children William 20, Elizabeth 17, Henry 15 and Sarah 11 and Francis 7. James has left home and is married to

Rebecca Holloway (31st December 1850) daughter of Thomas Holloway **(Gravestone 36)**, and is living next door to the family. James is a boatman. In 1853 James was dead aged 24 **(Gravestone 34)** on his headstone it gives reference to a child (But kindness show and pity take and love my infant for my sake.)



1861 Census: William Gaskin (sen) 60 was Coal Merchant and publican. He was living with his wife Elizabeth 59 and his daughter Sarah 21. Elizabeth Gaskin died in 1868.

James' wife Rebecca has remarried. Her husband is James Marsden and they are living with James' son Thomas William Gaskin 8 and Francis Marsden in the parish of Spondon.

Gravestone 5: (8a)

Ann Clementina Gaskin, b. 30 June 1867 d. Jan 1868 the daughter of William and Sarah and granddaughter of William Gaskin Senior.

1871 Census: William Gaskin (sen) 71 is now a widower; he is head of the household and a coal Merchant living on Coal Wharf Station Lane with his son William 40 also a coal merchant, his

son's wife Sarah 44 and his grandchildren Elizabeth 14 and Sarah 11.

William died in 1881 Granddaughter Elizabeth Died in 1879 aged 22 (Gravestone 1).

1881 Census: William (jun) 50 is living at The Wharf Station Inn with his wife Sarah. He is a Coal Merchant she is the Inn Keeper. Their daughter Sarah 21 is living there also, she is a dressmaker.

Sarah married Roadley Hunt on 27th February 1889 at St Werburgh's Church Spondon.

1891 Census: William (jun) 60 is now a widower; he is head of the household working as a Coal and Lime merchant living in Nottingham Road with Son-in-Law, Roadley Hunt (37) clerk working on the Railways, daughter Sarah (31) and grand-daughter Ethel 1.

William Gaskin (jun) died 13th June 1900 aged 69 and is buried alongside his daughter Elizabeth.

Probate William Gaskin of Spondon Derbyshire publican who died on 13th June 1900 probate granted to Sarah Rosamund Hunt (wife of Roadley Hunt) Effects £625 15s 8d (Today's money £70,704.13p)



1901 Census: Sarah head, running the Station Inn Derby Rd also registered Edith Newton, servant domestic.

In affectionate remembrance of Thomas Hardy who died November 11th 1874 aged 73. 'From sufferings and sins released and freed from every pain. He died in Jesus and is blest for he his home hath gained.'

Thomas Hardy was the son of Charles and Catherine Hardy and was baptised in the Parish Church on 14th October 1802.

1851 Census, Spondon:

Thomas Hardy (49) Farm Labourer, Ann his wife (49) and their children Joseph (14), Rose (11) scholar, John (4) scholar and Charles (2) all members of the family were born in Spondon.

1861 Census, Spondon:

Thomas Hardy (61) Agricultural Labourer, Ann (60) his wife, Laundress, and their sons John (14) and Charles (11) both agricultural labourers were all living in Spondon.

1871 Census, Spondon:

Thomas Hardy (70) Agricultural labourer was living in Church Street with his wife Ann (69) and two unmarried sons John (25) painter's labourer and Charles (22) painter and Glazier. Also living in the house was Elizabeth Napp 11 (boarder and scholar). She was born in Nottingham.

1881 Census, Spondon:

Ann (78) was a widow, an annuitant; she was living with her son John (33) General Labourer and his family in Church Street. John's wife was Martha (26) a charwoman and their children Alice (8) scholar, Thomas (6) scholar, William (4) scholar, Ann (2) Maria (7 months) and Charles Stevenson (9) nephew scholar.

Ann died in 1882 and was buried 13th May St Werburgh's Church Spondon.



In memory of Hugh Bates (late of Spondonwood farm) who died October 20th 1850 aged 79 years – Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord.

Buried 24th October 1850

Hugh married Hannah Stansby On 17th May 1821

Hannah was born in Smalley Derbyshire

1841 Census, Spondon: Hugh Bates head of household Farmer, Wood Farm, living with his wife Hannah and children Samuel (15) think this may have been an error and he was 19, and Hannah (15) and 5 agricultural labourers. (William Rawlins (20), Jane Clarke (15) George Kerry (14) William Hallsworth (40) Jude Hallsworth Female (35))

1851 Census, Spondon: Hannah Bates (68) widow, Farmer 140 acres, Samuel son (28) also registered Rebecca Butter (24), James Vann (18) and Arthur Brown (14) farm servants.

Hannah died aged 81 in 1864 and was buried at St Werburgh's Spondon on 1st November 1864.



Joseph Skevington was born C. 1851, he was the son of Augustus Skevington and Mary Potter.

Augustus and Mary were married on 17th Jan 1839

She was the daughter of John Potter and Miriam Coxon (Grave 35)

Augustus Skevington died in 1854.

Joseph Skevington died aged 15 February 28th 1866

1841 Census: Grange Farm Castle Donington Leics. Augustus 29, Mary 29 and Ann 3 months

1851 Census: Ann was living with Mary's brother John Potter and his mother Miriam in Morley. The 1851 census for Mary is difficult to read

1861 Census: Recorded on this census Joseph 11 was living with his widowed mother Mary 48 and two brothers Thomas 12, and Arthur 7 in Spondon. Mary was a proprietor of land and all the boys are recorded as scholars. Mary was born in Spondon but the two older boys were born in Staffordshire and the youngest, Arthur, Worcestershire.



1871 Census: 11 Abbey Street Derby

Mary Skevington (58) widow, head of family, Landowner, John P (28) Grocer, Augustus (25) Grocer and Thomas (22) Merchant's Clerk, unemployed

1881 Census: 7 Bramble Street Derby

Mary (69) widow annuitant, was living with her son John P Skevington head of household and his wife Jessie and their daughters Mary (2) and Edith(1) also recorded is servant Margaret Hallows (16)

Mary died in 1884 – probate was granted to Arthur Isaac Skevington of Morley son, and John Holland Potter nephew

In 1881 both Arthur and Ann Skevington were living with their Uncle John Potter farmer of 231 acres at Morley Hollow. Arthur was a farmer and Ann a housekeeper.

Rhoda Dedman was buried 23rd July 1861 at St Werburgh's Spondon, so could be the person named on the top half of the stone,

Also of Alfred Dedman who died August 5th 1868-Aged 4 years

Probably the son of John Moore Dedman and Francis Dedman – their son Alfred was baptised in Spondon March 1865. Francis was born in Stanley and John Rottingdean Sussex

1851 Census: Stanley Brook Spondon

Francis (28) houseworker, Rhoda (7) born in Stanley scholar, Sarah (5) Scholar, John (3) and Emma 7 months



1861 Census: John (41) and Francis (38) were living in Spondon, he was a coachman /domestic also listed were their children Sarah (14), John Moore (12), Emma (11) Richard Joseph (6) and William (3). Rhoda (18) was employed as a nursery maid for Fanny S Arkwright (Fund Holder) in Spondon.

1871 Census: Moor Street Spondon: John (51) head, Coachman/domestic, Francis (48) wife, and their children William (13), Lucy (8) and Ruth (4) all scholar.

1881 Census: Fishponds Spondon: John (61) head, coachman /domestic, Francis (58) wife, and their children Sarah (33) domestic servant unemployed, William (23) teacher and organist, Lucy (18) dressmaker, Francis R (14) scholar and granddaughter Edith E Wardle (1). All the children were born in Spondon Edith was born in Chesterfield.

1891 Census: Fishponds Spondon

John (72) head retired Coachman, Francis (68) wife and daughters Sarah (40) cook/ domestic and Ruth (24) at home domestic, plus Edith E Wardle granddaughter (11) scholar.

John Moore Dedman died 6th December 1899 and is buried in Spondon Cemetery. Probate granted to Richard Dedman cab-proprietor £344 184 1d

Francis Dedman his wife died June 1900



In loving memory of Thomas Bancroft who died September 5th 1880 Aged 76 years. and....Louisa wife of the above died 10th December 1876 Aged 69

Thomas was the son of William Bancroft and Charlotte Nadin, he was born in Ockbrook March 1806.

Thomas Bancroft married a Louisa Hitchcock, who was born in Hazlewood, in Duffield Derbyshire on 12th September 1825

Thomas was buried on the 12th September 1880 at St Werburgh's Spondon.

Probate was granted on the 24th November 1880 to Thomas Bancroft of Cotmanhay Rd Ilkeston joiner and Beer-house Keeper the son and sole executor. (Under £100)

1851 Census, Spondon: Thomas Bancroft (44) Joiner, Louisa (44) wife, and their



children James (20) Farm labourer, Maria (16) Glove Seamer, Thomas (15) Joiner, John (11) Aron (9) Louisa (8) Elizabeth (6) Mary (4) the rest of the children barring Mary were scholars, plus Robert Watts Lodger (35)

1861 Census, Spondon: Thomas Bancroft head (55) Joiner, Louisa wife (53) and their children Aron (21) joiner, Louisa (20), Elizabeth (18), Mary(16) and Granddaughter Ellen (16). All the females apart from Louisa were Mill Hands. All the children and Grandchild Ellen were born in Spondon. Also listed are William Robinson (5) Grandson who was born Basford Nottinghamshire and Robert Watts lodger. (In 1881 census, William (25) was living with his wife Mary in Brockley. He was a labourer at the colour works.)

1871 Census, Spondon Moor End: Thomas Bancroft (65) head joiner, Louisa (63) wife, son John unmarried (31) railway labourer, Louisa Rushton (6) born in Turkey granddaughter scholar and Robert Watts (56) Labourer

(Louisa was baptised 24th November 1867 – daughter of Enoch and Mary Rushton- a Louisa Rushton married Arthur Nuby Pares in 1886 in Spondon and in 1901 census was living on Moor End, her birth was in Turkey) An Enoch Rushton died at Kustenge Turkey 1864

In affectionate memory of John Williamson Potter son of Isaac and Annie Potter who died 4th May 1876 aged 34 (see also Gravestone 10,37)

Baptised 27th April 1845 St Werburgh's Spondon

John Williamson Potter married his cousin Mary Potter daughter of Joseph Potter and Hannah Holland 4th November 1869

They had a son Joseph Potter in 1873

Church record burial 9th May 1876 aged 31 years

1851 Census, Spondon: Isaac, father (43) head joiner, Anne mother (34), and their children John Williamson Potter (6), James (3) Annie Williamson Potter (8) and Sarah (1). Annie and James were scholars. Also listed John Williamson (79) Proprietor of houses and his wife Ann (78) and Elizabeth Morley (18) a house servant

1861 Census, Spondon: Isaac Father (52) head, builder employing 3 men and 2 boys, Anne mother (43) wife, Annie Williamson Potter (18) unmarried, John Williamson Potter (16) apprentice James(13) and Sarah(11) both scholars.



1871 Census, Spondon: John Williamson Potter was living at the White House Hill Street with his wife Mary. John was a Joiner.

John died in 1876

1881 Census, Spondon: Mary was still living on Church Hill, an annuitant, with her son Joseph (8) a scholar.

In 1901 Mary (61) was a tailoress living with her son Joseph (28) in Greenurch Ripley.

In 1911 Mary was living with son Joseph (37) Farmer and four servants at Hawley House Denby Derbyshire

Probate Record: Mary Potter of 22 Chapel Street Ripley widow died 16th December 1919. Administration Derby 25th Feb 1920 to Joseph Potter Gentleman £711 3s 5d

In loving memory of Annie Williamson Potter who died on 30th October 1898 aged 55 years until the day. Also of ...(James Potter?) (Linked to Gravestones 9, 37)

Annie was the daughter of Isaac and Ann Potter. She was baptised in Spondon on 23rd April 1843.

1851 Census, Spondon: Isaac father (43) head joiner, Anne mother (34), and their children John Williamson (6), James (3) Annie Williamson (8) and Sarah (1). Annie and James were scholars. Also listed John Williamson (79) Proprietor of houses and his wife Ann (78) and Elizabeth Morley (18) a house servant

1861 Census, Spondon: Isaac Father (52) head, builder employing 3 men and 2 boys, Anne mother (43) wife, Annie Williamson Potter (18) unmarried, John Williamson



Potter (16) apprentice James (13) and Sarah (11) both scholars.

1871 *Census, Spondon:* Isaac Father (62) widowed, builder employing 4 men, Annie Williamson Potter (28) unmarried, James Williamson Potter (23) unmarried plumber and glazier were living in Hill Street Spondon.

1881 Census, Spondon: Isaac Father (73) Widowed, retired Builder with Ann Williamson Potter, unmarried (38) and Emma Winfield (19) domestic servant were registered at Church Hill Spondon

1891 Census, Church Hill: James Potter (43) Farmer and his sister Annie Williamson Potter (48) living on own means.

Annie was unmarried when she died aged 55 in 1898

Probate: Derby to James Potter gentleman (brother) and Sarah Potter (sister) spinster effects £904 12s 5d

James died 23rd November 1900 and was buried at St Werburghs church Spondon on 27th November 1900.

Probate granted to Sarah Copeland wife of F Copeland, Emma Winfield Spinster and Joseph Bostock Gentleman £2365 8s 9d

Hannah Mary Biggins. Born June 22nd 1856 Died May 17th 1859. She was buried 21st May 1859 at St Werburgh's Church aged 2.

She was the eldest daughter of John Biggins and Hannah Hand.

Hannah and John were married in Spondon 23 February 1850.

1851 Census 1851, Spondon: John (22) was a groom and Hannah (20) a dressmaker.

1861 Census, Spondon: John (32) is now a horse-breaker, Hannah (30) a dressmaker. They have 3 children Charles (7) Frances (2) and Hannah Mary(2) (1 month old) –



on baptism records she is named as Anna Mary baptised 7th April 1861.

Charles died 1864 and Frances died 1866

1871 Census, Sitwell Street St Peters Becket ward: John (48) is a horse-breaker; Hannah (47) a wife, and children Hannah Mary (10), Ellen A (7), Julia (4), and Charles (2).

Although Julia is on the census aged 4 church records show a Julia Biggins daughter of Hannah and John was baptised 1878 at Spondon

Hannah Biggins mother died in 1876, she was buried on 9th January 1876 aged 45 at St Werburgh's Spondon.

John Biggins married Sophia Stafford in 1877 and they were living at 22 Eley Street (St Werburghs Becket) in 1881 with son Charles Arthur (13).

Hannah Mary (2) aged 20, housekeeper and Julia (13) pupil-teacher were living on Church Hill Spondon with their Grandmother Mary Boam

John Biggins died 1898 Alvaston

Sacred to the memory of Mary Ann Malin wife of Jervase Malin

Mary and Jervase were married at Breadsall Parish Church on 19 Feb 1851. Her previous name was Mary Ann Shelton, her father's name is recorded as Thomas Haslam.

Mary Ann was buried at St Werburgh's Church 12th June 1875

1851 Census: Jervase Malin (44) head, Farmer 194 acres wife Mary Ann (55) and daughter Ann E (2)

Thomas chose a career in the army and after his father had secured him a commission he joined the 29th Foot under the Duke of Wellington in the Peninsular War. He took part in the fierce struggle there from 1808 to 1812, including Salamanca, and particularly distinguished himself on the bloody day of Albuera in 1811, when every officer of the regiment senior to himself was killed or wounded, it fell to him, as a young lieutenant of 22, to lead the shattered but indomitable band in the final and triumphant rally. For these actions he won a distinction. After his marriage to Anne Emma Hurt of Alderwasley that he became slowly reconciled to the humdrum life of a County Magistrate in his home at Spondon, near Derby.

1861 Census, Spondon: Isaac (52) head, builder employing 3 men and 2 boys, Anne (43) wife, Annie Williamson Potter (18) unmarried, John Williamson Potter (16) apprentice James(13) and Sarah(11) both scholars.

1871 *Census, Spondon:* Isaac (62) widowed, builder employing 4 men, Annie Williamson Potter (28) unmarried, James Williamson Potter (23) unmarried plumber and glazier were living in Hill Street Spondon.

1881 Census, Spondon: Isaac (73) Widowed, retired Builder with his daughter Ann W, unmarried (38) and Emma Winfield (19) domestic servant were registered at Church Hill Spondon.

In affectionate remembrance of Ann Stevens who departed this life November 13th 1874 aged 75 years. Also of James her husband who died 1845 aged 44. Interred in Spondon churchyard, they have gone to the land of the blest. From their prison of sorrow and night they have snatched immortality's vest and mantled their spirits in light.

1861 Census, Spondon: Ann Stevens (60) widow,washerwoman, children John (23), Brickyard labourer, Enock(20) Railway labourer, Emma (17) Cotton Mill Hand, CharlotteRichardson (30) Boarder Organist blind/home birth



1871 Census, Spondon Moor Street: Ann (71) a widow, is now living with son John (31) a telegraph labourer Midland Rail, Mary Ann (28) his wife and daughter Catherine 10 Months

Ann died 13th November 1874 and was buried on 17th November 1874

1861 Census, Spondon: John Towle (37) Head Silk glove maker Sibella (37) wife Daughter Elizabeth (10) scholar

John remarried in 1866 to Mary A W Smith

1871 Census, Spondon Moor End: John Towle (45) Glove maker, Mary Towle (45) his wife and daughter Mary Towle (23) Dressmaker.



1841 Census, Spondon: Edward head (45) Silk Throwster, (Textile worker attending a machine that twisted strands of fibres into yarn.) Also registered are Maria (30) and their children Edward (7), Horatio (6), Charles (5), Margaret (4), James (3) Herbert (2) and

Anna 10 months. Anna Maria was christened at St Werburgh's Church on 27th August 1840 and buried there on 26th February 1842. Margaret Lloyd Simpson was Christened 10th March 1837 (Margaret Romana) at St Peter's Church Derby and buried at St Werburgh's on 6th May 1848

Edward was a partner with Edward Turner in a Silk Throwster Mill, Castlefields Mill Canal Street Derby (Simpson and Turner)

1851 Census, Spondon Belle View: Edward (55) head silk Manufacturer, his wife Maria (43), and their children Horatio (16) apprentice, Herbert (11) scholar, Maria (8) scholar, Llewellyn (6) scholar. Also registered in the census are Penelope (38) sister in law and two servants Mary Smith 20 and Sarah Kirkland 14.

Edward Lloyd junior (17) was registered at a school called Haileybury College in Stanstead Rd Hoddesdon Chapel. This school was founded by the East India Company to train future administrators and was run by a cleric.

Gravestone 53 In memory of Edward Lloyd son of Edward Lloyd and Maria Simpson who departed this life March 11th 1852 Aged 18. Also Maria their third daughter who died February 1st 1855 aged 12.

Henry Holbrook head (32) butcher, born in Ockbrook, wife Ann (30), born at Wirksworth, and their children Henry (8) William Malin (6) Ann (3) and John (1) all born in Spondon, also lodger Herbert Barber Wheelwright born in Lincoln

Henry was buried on the 7th June 1859 at St Werburgh's Church Spondon

1861 Census: On this Census John junior has taken over running the farm, still 95 acres John and Ann are still living there and so is Mary Ann. There is also John Holbrook nephew a plough boy, Emma Barton (15) house servant, George Woodcock (17) carter and Silas Kirkbrook (15) a cowboy.

Ann Holbrook (40) Widow of Henry was still living in Spondon with her children William Malin (16) wheelwright, Emma(8) and Elizabeth (5) Both scholars. Also Lodger William Elson and his wife and Peter Holbrook (3) scholar.

1871 *Census:* John and Mary are still at the farm and it is listed as Brunswood farm Ann is also on the census. Ann Holbrook widow of Henry is living with an aunt in Ockbrook.

On later census John and Mary moved to 5 Moor Street Spondon, they are buried in Spondon cemetery

Hary Ann Holbrook, the eldest daughter of John and Ann Holbrook of Brunswood Farm, was born on 30th April 1823 and died on 13th June 1893.

Nicholas was buried on 10th January 1873. Ann was buried 5th June 1878.

1881 Census: After the death of their parents George was married living on Moor End with his wife Mary and sister Lydia.



In memory of Clara the daughter of The Reverend Charles Chawner Vicar of Church Broughton . Clara died December $10^{\rm th}$ 1842 Aged 36

She was baptised at Church Broughton 3rd Jan 1807

Her parents were Charles Chawner and Dorothea Duesbury, (daughter Of William Duesbury the founder of Crown Derby) who were married at St Alkmunds Derby 29th December 1786

Charles was the son of Thomas and Elizabeth Chawner and was baptised in Sudbury on 15th August 1752



Charles was educated at Emmanuel College Cambridge entered Easter 1772.

Charles died 19th November 1819

Mother Dorothea Died on 1830 in Atherstone Warwickshire

1841 Census: Clara (30) was living in Uttoxeter Staffs with older sister Dorothea (50) and another Chawner relative probably a cousin Jane (75)

Also remembered on the gravestone was her sister Emma who died August 28th 1847 aged 40. (On St Werburghs records this is recorded as 45) She was buried 2nd September 1847 at St Werburgh's Church.

When Emma died her will states she was living in Spondon. (She left everything to her sister Dorothea living in Lichfield Staffordshire. Dorothea carried on living in Lichfield she died on 2nd August 1871).

1851 Census, Spondon: Robert Bates (54) head, farm labourer, Jane (47) charwoman, children Henry (17) servant, John (9) and Sarah (7). The two younger children were both scholars. Robert and all the children were born in Spondon. Jane was born in Stanley.

1861 Census, Spondon: Robert Bates (66), head, born in Spondon, labourer and Jane (60) his wife and their children Henry (27), John (19) both labourers and Ann (23) family servant.



1871 Census, Windmill Post Lane (somewhere near Royal Hill Rd): Robert Bates (73) Head, farm Labourer, his wife Jane (66), Henry (37) Railway Labourer, Ellen White granddaughter (8) born in Liverpool scholar. Ellen's mother Harriet had died soon after she was born.

In the 1881 Census Jane was living with Henry and his wife and two children on Windmill Post Lane.

In affectionate remembrance of Maria Lambert wife of John Lambert who died Oct 31st 1864 aged 65 years. Blessed are the dead which die in the lord. Also of John Lambert who died Feb 3rd 1883 aged 86.

1851 Census, Spondon: John head, (52) farm labourer, Maria his wife and their children Emily (21) a mill weaver and straw hat maker and Edward (18) an apprentice were all living in Spondon.

1861 Census, Spondon: John (63) farm labourer and Maria (63) are still living in Spondon.

Maria died 31st October 1864 and was buried on 2nd November 1864 at St Werburghs Spondon.

1871 Census: John (74) Farm Labourer was living alone on Moor End Spondon

1881 Census: John (84) was an unemployed Labourer living on Moor End Spondon

John died February 3rd 1883 and was buried at St Werburghs Spondon on 7th February 1883.

Eliza was buried 24th January 1878

Parents Tamar and Frederick were still living in Spondon (Moor End) in 1901

Tamar was still there in 1911 a widow living at 53 Moor End

1861 Census, Spondon: Fredric Frearson (30) a head miner was living with his wife Tamar (31) seamstress and their Children, John (7) scholar, Sarah Ann (5) scholar, Eliza (3) Scholar and Frederick 7 months.

1871 Census, Spondon Stanley Highway: Fredric (41) a woodman labourer, was living with his wife Tamar (41) and their children Eliza (14) Factory Girl, Fredric (12) Scholar, Hannah (8) Scholar, Reuben (3) Scholar and John (1).

Joseph Osbourne died on December 8th (Derby Mercury) and was buried at St Werburgh's Church on the 13 December 1852

Joseph was baptised at St Werburgh's Church Spondon 8th September 1779 the son of Joseph and Ann Osbourne.

Joseph married Sarah Harrison 4th November 1800 at St Alkmund's Church Derby

An Ann Alethea Osbourne was baptised at St Michael's Church Derby daughter of Joseph and Sarah Osbourne June 1804 .

Sarah Osbourne died on June 20 1809 and is buried in Spondon Churchyard – headstone standing by the baulk.

Ann Alethea Osbourne Was buried on 27th July 1843 at St Werburgh's Spondon. She was 39 when she died.

Joseph Osbourne then married Mary Anthill on 29th October 1821 at Spondon.

1851 Census, Spondon: Joseph Osbourne (71) Head Landed Proprietor/Superannuation List stamps and Taxes, Mary (58) wife, William Osbourne (28) druggist, Herbert Henry Holbrook (31) Visitor courier. The whole family were born in Spondon.



Mary died 11th August 1864 (probate record) she was buried on 17th August 1864 aged 71 (church record)

Joseph and Mary had four children William bapt. 6th October 1822 he died in Australia 1863.His first daughter was born in Australia 1855

Joseph bapt. 1st August 1824. He died 1859. James bapt 20th August 1826 he died 1847 and Isaac born 1829 died 1830.

(Mostly buried in front of Gravestone 15)

Charles was born about 1811 in Spondon Derby the son of William and Elizabeth Antill. He was baptised at St Werburgh's Church 13th February 1811.

Charles married Emma Ford on 30th April 1842 at St Werburgh's church Spondon.

1851 Census, Spondon Derby: Charles, head (40) Farmer of 28 acres Emma(26) his wife and their children Eliza Ann(6) scholar, Charles(5) scholar and Emma(2). The children were all born in Spondon. They were also two servants registered, Elizabeth Letting (19) house servant and Henry Coltons (31) Farm servant.

Child Emma died in 1852.

1861 Census, Spondon Derby: Charles Antill(50), farmer 26 acres employer, Emma(36) wife, Eliza Ann(16) farmer's daughter, Charles(15) farmer's son, William(9) scholar, Arabella(4) daughter, Elizabeth Sarah(2) also Charles Whittingham(14) servant carter.

Charles Antill died on the 14th September 1867 and was buried at St Werburgh's church Spondon on 17th September. Probate was granted to his widow Emma and Isaac Potter Builder (under £300)

1871 Census, Borrowash Spondon: Emma Antill(46) Landowner, William son(19) carpenter's apprentice, Arabella(14) scholar, Frank(9) scholar, Maud(6) scholar also registered Anna Ford, (81) mother annuitant. Anna was born in Stafford.

1881 Census, Borrowash (Nottingham Rd) Spondon: Emma Antill(56) Income from houses and land interest, William(29) son carpenter, Frank(19) Railway Clerk, Arabella (24) Maud (16)

Emma died 13th December 1885 probate(£352 7s) granted to son Charles Antill.
